### 1 Purpose of the Communication

As per ISA communication 144, States are required to only register skaters who have achieved the required ISA TES score/s. This communication sets out the process whereby States will submit skaters and reserves with their TES scores so that ISA can rank and fill divisions at the Australian Figure Skating Championships 2022 (AFSC).

### 2. Technical Requirements

Refer to ISA Communication 144.

### 3. Collecting Information.

ISA will provide State Secretaries with a template for States to complete via a google spreadsheet by the close of entries (25.10.22) to AFSC. States will provide the following information:

**Skaters Name**

**Proof of Age registration Number**

**TES score(s)**

**Total TES score (for reserves only)**

**Competition(s) where scores were obtained.**

There will be a separate TAB for each State and a different spreadsheet for Singles, Pairs/Dance/ Adults and Synchronized skating.

States need to include the reserves highest TES scores earned during the period, (and the total if more than one program/dance), so that ISA can rank them and invite the highest ranked reserves nationally to fill any positions in divisions where States are unable to fill their quota. Once selection has taken place, ISA will inform the State so that the State may nominate the additional entries.

### **Reserves Score Tabulation**

In order to Rank the reserves, ISA wants to use a consistent national approach for the tabulation of the information from each State. Each State will have their own requirements for the nomination of their 4 (or 5 host State) guaranteed athletes to AFSC 2022.

However the 5 **reserves** from each State should be ranked by the State, based on their highest TES scores earned during the period 1.1.22 – 24.10.22

Score/s may be obtained at Champs Series events, State Championships, International events or any event whereby the judging panel and tech panel have a minimum of 1 Nationally qualified judge and 1 Nationally qualified technical specialist/controller for that division on the panel for the event. Score/s are to be earned during the 2022 calendar year and prior to the close of AFSC 2022 entries (25.10.22). For clarity, the 2021 ISA National Competition scores should not be used.

If the division features two programs, or for Ice Dance, two pattern dances and a free dance, then the scores may be obtained in more than one event. The scores do not have to be earned in the same competition. Ice Dance may have three scores, the scores must be obtained in a minimum of two different pattern dances.

Each Member may put forward up to 5 reserves whom have earned the qualifying score. Where a Member cannot fill their quota spots with eligible skaters under this policy, then eligible skaters with the next highest score, whom are not already nominated, will be given the opportunity to fill the spots. The skaters scores for the reserves will be ranked Nationally by ISA from the scores put forward by the Members. The acceptance of any or all of the reserves will be based on the total quota for any division and will be advised by ISA after the close of entries.
