ISA is excited to announce that Special Achievement Award pins will be award to athletes meeting the performance related criteria set by High Performance, Development, ASPA, ISA Sys Committee.

Special Achievement Award pins will be awarded for Basic Novice, Intermediate Novice, Advanced Novice, Junior and Senior in the qualifying rounds, short program events and final round of free skate events at **Australian Nationals 2023.**

Pins will be awarded for the first time the criteria are achieved at the specified event (AFSC23):

Singles

Basic Novice/Intermediate Novice Adult Silver/Gold/Masters/Master's Elite

- The skater in the group with the highest combined point total for spins,(*more than 3 skaters in the event.*)
- The skater in the group with the highest total Skating Skills mark, (more than 3 skaters in the event.)
- Every skater that earns at least a minimum of 4, +2's or higher for an element and no negative GOE from any member of the panel.
- Align with ISU 2328: Jumps that earn a bonus and received a GOE of 0 with no; e,!,<, << or Fall. (Trimmed mean of 0)

Advanced Novice

- The skater in the group with the highest combined point total for spins, (more than 3 skaters in the event.)
- The skater in the group with the highest total Skating Skills mark, (at least 3 skaters in the group.)
- The skater that earns at least a minimum of 4, +2's or higher for an element and no negative GOE from any member of the panel.

Align with ISU 2328: Jumps that earn a bonus and received a GOE of 0 with no; e,!,<, << or Fall. (Trimmed mean of 0)

Junior

- The skater in the group with the highest combined point totals for spins, (more than 3 skaters in the event.)
- The skater that earns at least a minimum of 3, +3's or higher for an element.

Senior

- The skater in the group with the highest combined point totals for spins, (more than 3 skaters in the event.)
- The skater that earns at least a minimum of 3, +3's or higher for an element.

Pins will be awarded for the first time the criteria are achieved at the specified event (AFSC23):

Pairs

Basic Novice-Intermediate Novice Pairs

- The team in the group with the highest total Skating Skills mark. (More than 3 teams in the event)
- Every team that earns at least a minimum of 3, +2's or higher for an element and <u>no</u> <u>negative GOE from any judge on the panel.</u>

Advanced Novice Pairs

- The team in the group with the highest total Skating Skills mark. (More than 3 teams in the event)
- Each team that earns at least a minimum of 4, +2's or higher for an element.

Junior Pairs

• Each team that earns at least a minimum of 3, +3's or higher for an element.

Senior Pairs

• Each team that earns at least a minimum of 3, +3's or higher for an element.

Pins will be awarded for the first time the criteria are achieved at the specified event (AFSC23): Dance

Basic Novice-Intermediate Novice Dance

- Each team that receives a <u>minimum of 3, +1's and 1, +2,</u> on a segment of a Pattern Dance.
- Each team that receives a minimum of <u>4, +2's</u> on an element in the FD and **no** negative GOE from any judge on the panel.

Advanced Novice Dance

- Each team that receives a minimum of 4, +2's on a segment of a Pattern Dance no negative GOE from any judge on the panel.
- Each team that receives a level 3 for any segment of a pattern dance, with a trimmed mean of 0.

• Each team that receives minimum of 4, +2's on an element in the FD and <u>no</u> <u>negative GOE from any judge on the panel.</u>

Junior Dance

- Each team that receives a minimum of 3, +3's on an element in the RD/FD.
- Each team that receives a level 3 for the Pattern dance element, with a trimmed mean of 0. If there are two pattern dance elements, it can only be awarded once per competition (AFSC23).

Senior Dance

• Each team that receives a minimum of 3, +3's on an element in the RD/FD.

Solo Dance

Basic Novice

- Each skater that receives a minimum of 3, +2, on a segment of a Pattern Dance.
- Each skater that <u>receives a minimum of 4, +2's on an element in the FD and no negative GOE from any judge on the panel.</u>

Intermediate Novice

- Each skater that receives a minimum of 3, +2, on a segment of a Pattern Dance.
- Each team that receives a <u>minimum of 4, +2's on an element in the FD and no</u> negative GOE from any judge on the panel.

Advanced Novice

- Each skater that receives <u>a minimum of 4, +2's</u> on a segment of a Pattern Dance <u>no</u> <u>negative GOE from any judge on the panel.</u>
- Each skater that receives a level 3 for any segment of a pattern dance, with a trimmed mean of 0.

Junior

- Each skater that receives a minimum of 3, +3's on an element in the RD/FD.
- Each skater that receives a level 3 for the Pattern dance element, with a trimmed mean of 0. If there are two pattern dance elements, it can only be awarded once per competition (AFSC23).

Senior

Each team that receives a minimum of 3, +3's on an element in the RD/FD.

Pins will be awarded for the first time the criteria are achieved at the specified event (AFSC23): Synchro

Basic Novice-Advanced Novice

- The team in the group with the highest total Skating Skills mark. (More than 2 teams in the event)
- Each team that receives a minimum of 4, +2's GOE's on an element in the FS with no negative GOE from any judge on the panel.

Junior-Senior

- The team in the group with the highest total Skating Skills mark. (More than 2 teams in the event)
- Each team that receives a minimum of 3, +2's GOE's on an element in SP or FS.
