Having been involved since 2019 in an operational role for ISA, I would like to take the next step in having an active involvement on the ISA Board.

During my time as Sport Development Chair I have worked to improve the areas under my jurisdiction and for the sport generally. Some of the achievements have included:

- Development of two apps for the sport Aussie Skate and ISA Tests. These have been very well received and have enhanced our sport's resources
- Facilitating the implementation of Uplifter which is our new Aussie Skate Membership Registration portal. This has the potential to be a national registration database.
- Revising the Aussie Skate Curriculum and judging system. This involved revising the levels which
 has provided greater flexibility to help skaters move through the sport. The Adult Freeskating
 curriculum particularly has included new levels tailored to help this growing area
- Working to improve communications with Aussie Skate members and coaches
- Liaising with rinks, coaches and participants, including rinks joining the program. Particularly have worked with the Darwin Ice Skating Rink and Figure Skating Association of NT to provide mentorship and assist the newly formed association to navigate through the world of figure skating
- Participating and organising Google Classroom sessions, currently focussing on Adult sessions

As well as my Sport Development duties, I am also the Web Administrator for the ISA website. This recently involved getting the new website up and running. Now I am currently managing the website, including uploading all updated documents and fine tuning the usability.

Apart from my Sport Development role, there is probably not much else I haven't done within the sport. This includes being a senior level judge, technical panels (including data and video), using and training computer systems, organising competitions, committee roles (currently FSAT and previously ISV Secretary) and club committees. This has given me an extensive and varied knowledge of the how the sport operates technically and administratively.

Professionally I work as a Safety Administrator at a zinc company in Hobart. My role requires high level administrative skills, developing procedures, safety committee administration, support and training of the Incident Management System and management of the company's Biological Monitoring program.
